Compost

Organic materials: food, green waste, soiled paper and cardboard
All that can be eaten

Fruits and vegetables Milk products Egg and nut shells

Bread, pasta and other cereal products Coffee grounds and filters, tea bags

Tables scraps Meat and poultry Fish and seafood

To avoid odours, place organic matter in a paper bag or wrap meat, fish and seafood in newspaper.

Green Waste

Dead leaves Branches Grass cuttings Plants

Others

Paper towels and paper tissues Soiled paper and cardboard products Compostable tableware Animal litter

Recycling

Containers, packaging and print items made of paper, cardboard, plastic, glass or metals. Empty and rinse all articles.

Cardboard

Glass

Tetra Pak®

Soft Plastics

If it's stretches out, it's recyclable! Place all in a plastic transparent bag and tie it up.

Hard Plastics

Must contain the recycling symbol **except for # 6!**

Garbage

Only if it can't be reused, recycled, composted or recovered!

Non-recyclable plastics

Mixed material packaging

All items made of different materials that cannot be separated at the recycling center.

Collection guidelines

- 1 Leave a two-foot clearance around the bin (between a fence, a car or even another bin).
- 2 Write your street address on each of your bins. (This will help us to correctly identify them).
- 3 Take out your bin the day before scheduled pickup. Why? Because the truck can pass as early as 6 a.m.
- 4 Ensure that no materials are sticking out or are on the ground next to the bin.
- 5 If there are two collections on the same day, place the brown bin so that it will be seen first by the driver
- 6 Wheels pointing towards the house.
- 7 To find out how to proceed in case of damage, call us or visit our website ritmrg.ca as soon as you notice the problem.
- 8 Placed at a maximum distance of 10 feet from the white pavement line, neither on the sidewalk nor on the street.
- 9 Put out garbage or recycling bin only when it is full.



Garbage collection every three weeks

Why increase garbage collection to every third week?

- Reduces operational costs
- Will increase participation in recycling and composting
- Prevents the collection of near-empty containers (however, take out your compost container regularly to avoid odours).
- To prepare for the implementation of unit-based pricing.

ATTENTION! Our inspectors are authorized to verify individual containers placed curbside to ensure compliance with regulation No. 1430-20 regarding waste management.

What to do if my garbage container is full?

- Sort your waste properly. Only true waste should be thrown in the trash, not recyclable or compostable materials.
- Bring your construction waste, electronic products, paint and other recyclable materials your nearest eco-center.



In Winter

Place your bin at a distance of approximately 10 feet from the white line to prevent damage from the snowplow.

In the event of a winter storm, collection may be delayed.



Can I request a second garbage container?

- Yes, although fees will be applied to each additional container AND no recyclable or compostable material may be found inside.

How may I obtain a brown or blue container?

- **Brown (compost):** Contact us at 418 368-2104, ext. 8507
- **Blue (recycling):** Can be purchased at your local hardware store. Call us to provide the serial number.
