- Separate the materials that make up the packaging (e.g., remove the bag from the cereal box).



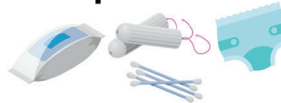

Collection guidelines

- 1 Leave a two-foot clearance around the bin (between a fence, a car or even another bin).
- 2 Write your street address on each of your bins. (This will help us to correctly identify them).
- 3 Take out your bin the day before scheduled pickup. Why? Because the truck can pass as early as 6 a.m.
- 4 Ensure that no materials are sticking out or are on the ground next to the bin.
- 5 If there are two collections on the same day, place the brown bin so that it will be seen first by the driver
- 6 Wheels pointing towards the house.
- 7 To find out how to proceed in case of damage, call us or visit our website ritmrg.ca as soon as you notice the problem.
- 8 Placed at a maximum distance of 10 feet from the white pavement line, neither on the sidewalk nor on the street.
- 9 Put out garbage or recycling bin only when it is full.



In Winter

Place your bin at a distance of approximately 10 feet from the white line to prevent damage from the snowplow.

In the event of a winter storm, collection may be delayed. Keep an eye on our communications.

Why are we still talking about this?

Inside the technical landfill site, waste is buried in cells that have a lifespan of five years—and they are becoming increasingly expensive! This has an impact on the annual tax.

A tax calculated based on our annual waste generation?

In 2026, major waste generators will face an additional tax. This targets households that put out more than one waste bin for collection.

Reminder: Regulation 328-2020 states that only one 240 L or 360 L waste bin per dwelling unit is allowed (sections 3.1 and 3.2).
