- Empty and lightly rinse the containers.
- Take apart and fold your cardboard boxes.
- Separate the materials that make up the packaging (e.g., remove the bag from the cereal box).

Collection guidelines

- 1 Leave a two-foot clearance around the bin (between a fence, a car or even another bin).
- Write your street address on each of your bins. (This will help us to correctly identify them).
- Take out your bin the day before scheduled pickup. Why? Because the truck can pass as early as 6 a.m.
- 4 Ensure that no materials are sticking out or are on the ground next to the bin.
- 5 If there are two collections on the same day, place the brown bin so that it will be seen first by the driver
- 6 Wheels pointing towards the house.
- 7 To find out how to proceed in case of damage, call us or visit our website ritmrg.ca as soon as you notice the problem.
- 8 Placed at a maximum distance of 10 feet from the white pavement line, neither on the sidewalk nor on the street.
- Put out garbage or recycling bin only when it is full.



In Winter

Place your bin at a distance of aproximately 10 feet from the white line to prevent damage from the snowplow.

In the event of a winter storm, collection may be delayed. Keep an eye on our communications.

Why are we still talking about this?
